Staff & Pupil Wellbeing Sessions

Claire Clinton and Lucy Still (AHT at Plashet School) lead these sessions which are proving popular with schools across Newham. Sessions or lessons can focus on staff or on pupils or a combination of both. Our work with schools is bespoke. The sessions last from 1 hour to 1.5 hours.

Session 1: Why staff wellbeing is important

This twilight will give staff an understanding of the pressures encountered in their work life and how these play out. It will give staff practical activities they use in their lives to ensure they can live their life in education well, but learn how to switch off.

Session 2: Successful strategies to enable pupil wellbeing

This twilight will give staff understanding and experience of successful strategies that work for pupils to help them become more emotionally resilient.

Session 3: Modelling Stilling

This lesson would model for teachers how to work well with pupils to help them become more emotionally resilient and enhance their well being. This in turn supports pupils to be able to engage with their learning effectively in schools.

Cost per session: £250 to partnership schools; £300 to non-partnership schools

Student RE Matters

Student RE Matters has been running in Newham for over 19 years now. It is known nationally for the innovative work it has produced on faith, religion and young people. Student RE Matters gives students the opportunity of developing leadership skills through the time that they attend.

Student RE Matters provides schools with the opportunity to:

- Promote dialogue between young people of differing religions and worldviews and cultures, supporting collaborative work and
- Contribute to community benefit, as it seeks to develop young people's skills in understanding their concerns and provides a place for them to learn to become a initiator and developer of solutions

Student RE Matters exists to give Newham students a place where they can discuss spiritual and moral issues which are important to them and learn more about religions and worldviews. For 2024-2025, having won a grant we are delighted to say we will be coming out to schools to run **FREE** workshops on challenging religious and non-religious worldviews.

What will we be doing?

The roadshow will be a 2-hour programme, that will support schools in dealing with the topic of stereotyping and how to overcome it. The roadshow is based on work from 2022/23, when students had opportunities to meet and interview representatives from various religious and worldview perspectives. They engaged in discussions about stereotyping, shared their experiences, and explored ways to combat and conquer it.

Student SACRE

What is different this year?

- The 'Challenging Stereotypes Roadshow' will be visiting 8 locations across the Borough, giving easy access for each secondary school, allowing more students to take part.
- Each school will attend 3 sessions one in the Autumn term of 2024 and one in the Spring Term of 2025, with a final meeting early in the summer term 2025 on zoom (as Exam season approaches)
- Two schools will work together in the Autumn and Spring terms, and we will all meet together on zoom in the summer.
- A host school will be able to bring three Year 8 or Year 9 classes to each session, a visiting school will be able to bring 2 classes of Year 8 or Year 9 classes to each session, so there will be 150 students in each session.

What will be the same this year?

- An opportunity for students from different schools and backgrounds to learn from each other and to work together on a project inspired by young people in Newham.
- Each workshop will use interactive activities, with leaders from local religious and non-religious worldview groups to explore ways to challenge and overcome religious and worldview stereotyping.
- An opportunity for students to meet and talk with local Faith Leaders
- An opportunity for schools to work with the Secondary RE Advisory team in Newham
